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### **BUDGET PROMISES: BEYOND PARLIAMENT**

**"Budget Promises: Beyond Parliament"** is a dashboard under publicfinance.lk that tracks the government's performance in delivering on its budget promises made in the annual budget speech.

The dashboard was launched in 2017 and seeks to answer two basic questions about the promises the government makes in its annual Budget Speech:

- (i) Is the government doing what it is saying?
- (ii) Is the government saying what it is doing?

By giving the public access to the answers to these questions, the dashboard aims to;

- (i) Improve visibility of the government's budget promises; and
- (ii) Hold it accountable for these promises.

### **HOW IT WORKS**

Due to the absence of a budget speech in 2020, the platform tracked 24 cabinet decisions—a combination of expenditure and regulatory policy decisions—made from January to June 2020. The decisions tracked were chosen based on the ability to identify an implementing agency and those that contained trackable outcomes. In 2019, the progress of budget proposals were hindered as a result of the Easter Sunday Attacks. Therefore, 8 proposals from the 2019 Budget Speech were chosen to assess their progress in 2020.

Historically, the platform tracked the following:

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> In 2017 and 2018, the selection threshold was based only on the proposed allocation of expenditure for the proposals. In 2019, the selection threshold was based on the addition of the proposed allocation proposal and its already allocated amount, due to the change in reporting format of the Budget Speech.



The platform is updated twice a year and assesses each of expenditure proposals using two indicators: **Openness** and **Progress.** The implementation of policy proposals is tracked using a single **Progress** indicator. The status of policy proposals were mainly assessed through publicly available information, and did not rely on requests filed under the Right To Information Act. Hence, the assessment of policy proposals does not have an indicator on openness.

A mid-year assessment of performance for the first six months is released in October of the year and an assessment of performance for the full year is released in April/May of the following year.<sup>2</sup>

# **1. CABINET DECISIONS**

### **1.1. OPENNESS TRACKER**

This tracks to what extent the government is **saying what it is doing** about each cabinet decisions/promise. It measures the government's level of disclosure of information about the implementation of each cabinet decision/proposal. The tracker uses information obtained via relevant government websites and requests filed under the Right to Information (RTI) Act. In 2017 and 2018, information was also collected via visits to government agencies and informal requests with the agencies. However, this method of information collection has been discontinued.

The mid-year assessment measures the extent to which the government has been open about disclosing information on the implementation of the first six months of progress on cabinet decisions/budget promises. The year-end assessment measures the government's openness on disclosing information on progress for the full year.

The openness categories are common to both expenditure and policy cabinet decisions/proposals.

Openness is based on the information available at the time of assessment and is categorised as follows:

#### **1.2. OPENNESS RANKINGS FOR GOVERNMENT AGENCIES**


This provides a comparative ranking of the openness of government agencies in disclosing information about the cabinet decisions/promises they are responsible for. Each agency receives a score between 0 – 4, 4 indicating the highest level of openness. Government agencies are then ranked from highest to lowest, indicating their relative performance during the year.

Historically, the aggregate score for the government agency is generally calculated as a weighted average of the scores of each cabinet decision under the purview of the agency. Each cabinet decision is scored on a scale of 0 to 100. The score for each individual cabinet decision is calculated based on (i) the usability of the information in evaluating the progress of the cabinet decision and (ii) the ease of obtaining this information.

In 2020, due to the inability to obtain information on the allocations due to the lack of a budget speech that year the rankings of the agencies were calculated using a simple average method.

**Usability of information**: Each cabinet decision receives an initial score of 0, 1, 2, 3, or 4 based on whether the information available is fully usable, partially usable or unusable.

**Ease of obtaining information**: The initial score on the usability is adjusted based on the ease of obtaining the information. Proactive disclosure, i.e. providing information online is given a higher score comparison to reactive disclosure, i.e. obtaining information through requests filed under the Right to Information Act (RTI Act).

# **2. EXPENDITURE PROPOSALS**

### 2.1. PROGRESS TRACKER

This tracks to what extent the government is **doing what it is saying**. It evaluates the level of progress of the government in implementing the promises, based on timelines and milestones established by the agency responsible.

For *the mid-year assessment* progress is categorised as follows:

# **3. REGULATORY PROPOSALS**

In 2019, the platform expanded its scope to track the progress of policy commitments made by the government in the Budget Speech. These cabinet decisions do not have an expenditure allocation.

The cabinet decisions/proposals were selected on the basis of requiring legislative enactment or a regulatory notification (gazettes) to be considered as "Implemented" or "Partially implemented". Information was obtained from publicly available information such as gazette notifications, government circulars, and Department of Government Information communiques on cabinet decisions, and requests filed under the Right to Information Act.

#### **3.1. PROGRESS TRACKER**

This tracks the level of progress made by the government in implementing the policy proposals introduced in the Budget Speech.
